Here's why we are not selling Impatiens this year

- Affected by downy mildew, almost all Impatiens *walleriana* (regular) withered before the end of the season last year.
- The disease may remain in the soil for several years and infect any Impatiens *walleriana* replanted in the same place.
- THERE IS NO CURE FOR THIS DISEASE.

Since we cannot offer complete assurance of good garden performance throughout the season, we prefer not to sell Impatiens *walleriana* this year.

Good news

- Some Impatiens species are not affected by this disease.
- The disease does not affect other plants in your landscape.
- THERE IS A WHOLE RANGE OF COLORFUL ANNUALS THAT CAN SUCCESSFULLY REPLACE IMPATIENS WALLERIANA.

- Begonia boliviensis

- Browallia speciosa

- Oxalis
- Torenia

- Antirrhinum (snapdragon)
- Celosia
- Cosmos
- Dahlia
- Fuchsia
